Responsible and Reverent.






AHG Inclusion Policy


AHG is committed to making its program available to girls of all abilities, so Special Needs Training has been created to help equip Leaders in this endeavor.

Level Awards

- At each program level girls will be working toward their level award which is designed to make sure girls have a well-rounded experience in the AHG program.
- Steps toward earning the Level award include badgework, leadership opportunities, special event participation, and community service hours.

Badoes

- AHG Badges span a huge variety of topics and interests.
- Each Badge has a list of requirements for each Level, but each Badge can be earned again later at higher levels to build on skills and interests.
- Badges incorporate the Faith Emphasis such as Bible Basics, Daughter of the King, and Mission Minded.
- · Many badges also require older girls to lead younger girls.
- · Earning badges provides girls the opportunity to learn a wide array of life skills, encouraging them to become lifelong learners and doers.
- Our Troop will complete 3 badges during Troop meetings and activities in a program year. Girls are encouraged to earn other badges at home if they would like to.
- Unit Leaders work with the girls to plan their activities which revolve around their AHG Badge Requirements.



- · Parents must sign in & out their children (15 & under)

Service Projects

A huge part of AHG is serving our community.

- We will strive to do 4 Service Projects each year
- Examples
 - iServe Ministry Food Truck
 - HUGS Duffle Bags
 - Service to our Charter church
 - Community service chosen by girls
 - Operation Christmas Child
 - Wreaths Across America





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Participation Costs

- \$40/year AHG Registration
 - Paid by family to AHG upon registering online
 - \$105 Sister Cap fee for 3 or more girls in a family
- \$16/month Troop Dues
 - Paid to Troop on first meeting night of every month. Covers meetings, events, and awards earned.
- \$20/year Program Fee
 - Paid by Troop to AHG per girl
 - \$50 Sister Cap fee for 3 or more girls in a family
 - Typically covered by our annual fundraiser

- Class A Uniform (click here for more information about AHG Uniforms and what is required)
 - AHG offers Uniform packages that include all essential uniform items (besides bottoms) as well as a Handbook
 - Tenderhearts/Explorers: \$85 uniform package + cost of bottoms
 - Pioneers/Patriots: \$66 uniform package + cost of bottoms
- Class B Uniform
 - AHG Official Class B T-Shirt (red or blue) \$14.99





Parent Volunteering

- Our troop's success is 100% dependent on parent volunteers
- Not everyone is a "teacher" but we all have something we can teach or share. Not everyone is good at administrative support or planning, but we can all be supportive
- Registered positions in the troop require an application process, interview, child-safety training, etc. We take the safety of the girls very seriously, and that includes screening all adults who will be registered with our troop. Many positions have additional specific required training.
- Adult registration with AHG is \$40/year.







How to Join our Troop

There are 3 easy steps to joining our troop!

- 1. <u>Make sure our troop is a good fit for your family.</u> Carefully read our AHG GA3106 Basic Troop Information (this document). If you have any questions please contact us! We are always happy to answer any and all questions you have.
- 2. If our troop seems like a good fit for you, the next step is to <u>visit a troop meeting</u>. All girls are allowed and encouraged to visit one troop meeting before joining. Please contact us to set up a visit to our next troop meeting!
- 3. Register & pay the girl's registration fee on AHGfamily.org. We will ask for your cell phone number and and email address, then you will be sent a link from American Heritage Girls to register your daughter with our troop.
